WHY CONSIDER A TRANSFER PROGRAM?

Attend MSU-Bottineau for your first two years and earn one of our transfer degrees, an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS). By earning an associate degree, you meet the general education requirements of MSU-Bottineau and the North Dakota University System. You will then be ready to transfer to a four-year college or university. Enjoy small class sizes, individual attention, and financial savings for the beginning years of your college experience.

WHAT IS GENERAL EDUCATION?

At MSU-Bottineau, general education consists of classes in communication, arts and humanities, social science, math, science, and technology. These required courses are designed to introduce you to a wide range of skills and disciplines. General education courses give you the opportunity to develop your communication and thinking skills, knowledge and application of technology, understanding and appreciation of society, and lifelong learning interests. MSU-Bottineau believes that students need not only to specialize in a major, but also to be broadly educated.

WHAT TYPES OF CLASSES WILL I TAKE?

When you plan to earn an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree, you will take general education classes plus courses from your area of interest. With careful planning, you will earn credits necessary for your major and you could be halfway to a bachelor's degree.
